






SHOOTOUT in the The fourth annual Shooter's 21 event raised \$9,000 for water safety programs and drew 75 participating boats. Dozens of spectator boats lined the course perimeter.





Shooter's 21, a favored hot-boaters' watering hole and bench-racing arena for a number of years, has turned the Lake of the Ozarks' performance persona up a notch with an annual gathering that has evolved into a full-fledged event.

The format is as old as time, with some high-tech twists. A small entry fee buys two timed runs; this year's radar gun was manned by volunteers from Mercury Marine.

Additional runs can be made as time permits, and trophies are awarded for top speed in a variety of classes.


The emphasis, however, is not on competition, although the numbers are closely monitored by participants and spectators alike from boats that



surround the proceedings and shoreline and via closed-circuit video that's piped directly into Shooter's well-stocked retreat.

"It's definitely a highlight around here," observed Shooter 21 owner Carmello Natoli, who organizes and conducts the event. "It's only going to get bigger."

This year's field included entries from Florida and California and was replete with such performance mainstays as Warlocks, Black Thunders, Fountains, Checkmates, Talons, and an array of other marques.

Top speed of 101.7 mph was clicked off by David Brown's *Radical*, a twin turbine-powered Warlock cat that narrowly nudged last year's winning 99-mph run by Bob Morgan's 43-foot *Team Big Thunder*.

There was one number that was even more significant than the speeds: The event raised over \$9,000 for the water safety and fire patrol that helps make Lake of the Ozarks a better place to boat.

Plans are already under way for the fifth annual Shootout, slated for August 28-29.
